**Sites of mass extermination—current plight, status, and  
where they fit**

The sites of mass extermination are often left on the wayside, yet on these grounds of grief lay the ashes and bones of the Jews. These are the sites chosen for the sole intent of mass murder of the Jewish people. More Jews were murdered in these camps than in Auschwitz. Despite this, they are the undiscussed, the unmentioned, and often left on the wayside. Exact numbers of perished can never be precise and are often underestimated. Little documentation remains. But archaeological work is and has been done. More discoveries are being made.
